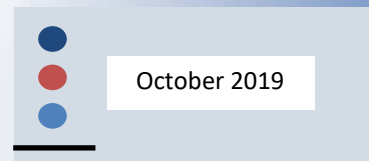

## Road Safety and the One Way System



With the cold, wet, dark mornings ahead, it is now more important than ever to ensure that all parents adhere to the one way system on the road outside the school and that all students cross the road with the assistance of our traffic wardens.

The one way system, (which runs from the direction of the church toward the school) helps with the traffic flow and supports your children in entering and leaving the school safely. The

clearway outside the school is NOT a drop off area. On wet mornings it is acceptable for children to arrive at school at 9am.

## Cross Country



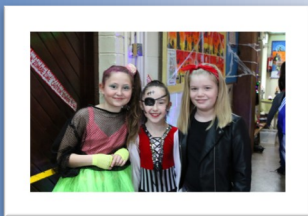
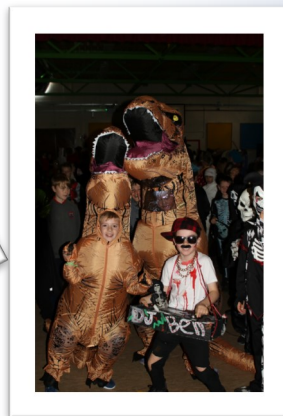
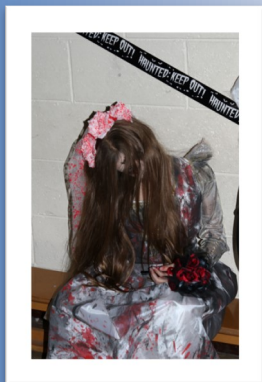
